FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR NILES ><> Why are You Weeping?

"Having said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing, but she did not know that it was Jesus. ¹⁵ Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." ¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned and said to him in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means Teacher). ¹⁷ Jesus said to her, "Do not cling to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" ¹⁸ Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"—and that he had said these things to her." ~John 20:14-18~

As we celebrate the joy of Easter, we turn to the powerful moment in John 20:14-18, where Mary Magdalene encounters the risen Christ. This passage is one of profound transformation—mourning turns to joy, confusion gives way to recognition, and despair is

replaced with hope. Mary stands weeping outside the empty tomb, overwhelmed by sorrow. Even when Jesus appears before her, she does not immediately recognize Him. It is only when He calls her by name—"Mary"—that her eyes are opened. In that instant, she knows her Lord has conquered death.

This moment mirrors our own faith journeys.

Often, in times of sorrow and uncertainty, we may struggle to see
Christ's presence in our lives. Yet, He calls us by name in our Baptism,
through His Word, and in the Sacraments. He does not remain distant
but draws near to comfort and restore us. Every time we gather as God's
people around His sacraments, Christ draws us together into His presence
for grace, strength, and forgiveness. They are brilliant reminders that one
day, we will be resurrected like Christ and in His presence eternally.

Jesus then commissions Mary: "Go to my brothers and say to them,
'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." Here, we see Christ's
great mission unfolding. His resurrection is not just a victory over the grave but a declaration of
restored fellowship with God. Through faith in Christ, we share in this relationship as children of
the Heavenly Father. We confess with joy that Christ is truly risen! This is not a symbolic victory
but a real, bodily resurrection, affirming His triumph over sin, death, and the devil. Like Mary,
we are called to bear witness to this good news. We do so in our congregations, in our families,
and in our daily vocations.

This Easter, may we hear Christ's voice calling us anew. May we recognize Him in Word and Sacrament, rejoice in His victory, and go forth with boldness to proclaim: *Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!*



BETHLEHEM LUTHERAN SCHOOL - WISCONSIN PARENTAL CHOICE PROGRAM

Bethlehem Lutheran School is participating in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program for the 2025-2026 school year. The Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP) provides children throughout the state with a full tuition voucher to attend the private or religious school of their choice. This program allows families in the Sheboygan area to access the educational program at Bethlehem Lutheran; especially families who in the past might not have been able to afford to attend. Bethlehem will be accepting applications for grades 4K-8 for parents who wish to enroll their children at the school through the WPCP. Student applications for the WPCP can be submitted online up until April 17, 2025 at https://sms.dpi.wi.gov/ChoiceParent/. There is also a link that can be found on our website www.ourbethlehem.com.

The program currently is limited to those families with incomes below 220% of the federal poverty level. Contact the school office at 920-452-5071 for assistance or for more details.




