


### FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR NILES

### The Challenge of Evangelism

"..[B]ut in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect...." ~ 1 Peter 3:15 ~

On vicarage (an internship for a student during their third year of seminary education), I had to complete an evangelism project. I worked to bring in a pastor in the district to do evangelism training

for the congregation. During part of that day of training, the members and I went out to made cold calls on houses in the town. We had a script to follow. The script was very similar to the Kennedy evangelism method. After introducing ourselves, the first question we were supposed to ask the person, in whose doorway we were intruding, was "If you died today, do you know where you would end up?" More than a couple times, the door was deservedly slammed in our face. I remember being dejected about this. If this was evangelism, I really wanted no part in doing it.



I have a suspicion that when people think about evangelism, this is similar to the situation they imagine. People telling you to get off their property. Doors being slammed in your face. Feelings of rejection and failure cloud our minds with fear. That day happened 17 years ago, and it still plagues my thoughts on occasion.

A few years later, I was on a servant event with thirty youth adults in the mountains of Colorado. We were clearing land and creating paths at camp for horses, bikers, and hikers. It was hard work, and the youth and adults handled it marvelously. One night after our campfire devotion, I noticed a young man hanging back after everyone had gone off to the cabins. He was just sitting staring at the fire. I went over and sat down next to him. All of a sudden he put his head on my shoulder and began to sob. He begins unloading all of the things that were going on in his life. He revealed that he was unsure that God cared about him anymore. I began to recite the words to "Jesus Loves Me" to him with special emphasis on "the Bible tells me so". He stopped crying, and started laughing. He said, "Pastor, that was so corny!" I replied with, "Yeah, I am. But that doesn't make it any less true." He responded with a smile and "I know".

I am not going to pretend to have all of the answers when it comes to evangelism. But I do know that evangelism happens best when it is done vocationally. In the organic situations that arise in your life, God gives you opportunities to give a reason for the hope that you have and the hope that others can have too! We become stewards of these opportunities for vocational evangelism at work, at school, at family gatherings, in the park, or in line at the grocery store. We dare not overcomplicate it. We listen. We answer. We proclaim Jesus. It can be corny. It can be simple. It can be unrefined. It is still effective because it is God who does the work through you. You are simply the steward of the opportunity. I pray that God gives you ample opportunities to be stewards of the evangelism opportunities that He provides!


