< Tischreden with Pastor Hanson ><>

Welcome to Table Talk with Pastor Hanson! Pull up a chair and let's talk about the means by which we Lutherans receive God's grace and his promises of forgiveness, life, and salvation.

This month, our Holy Gospel readings in church take a break from St. Mark's Gospel readings and flips to St. John's account. The reason for this is because St. Mark does not record the profound conversation that Jesus had with crowd following the feeding of the 5,000. In this teaching by Jesus, he admonishes the crowd for seeking physical food from Jesus and urges them to seek eternal food from heaven. This food will nourish their eternal souls, rather than their temporal bellies. Following these set of readings from St. John, we return to St. Mark, chapter 7. Here Jesus confronts the Pharisees who complain to Jesus about ceremonial washing. This gives Jesus an opportunity to teach them, and us, about the difference between human traditions and divine ordinances.

The Sacrament of the Altar: Nourishment for Eternal Life

In John 6:22-69, Jesus introduces Himself as the Bread of Life, offering a profound teaching on the Sacrament of the Altar. After miraculously feeding the 5,000, Jesus addresses the crowd seeking Him, urging them to seek not perishable food, but the food that endures to eternal life. He declares, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst" (John 6:35).

As Lutherans, we understand this teaching as a reference to the Lord's Supper. Jesus offers His true body and blood under the forms of bread and wine. In verses 51-58, He makes a radical assertion: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh" (John 6:51). This statement was challenging even to His disciples, but it underscores the Sacramental Union of Christ in the Lord's Supper, as his body and blood come together with the bread and wine.

The Sacrament of the Altar is a Means of Grace, providing the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation from God. It is a profound mystery that we embrace by faith, trusting in Christ's promise. As we partake in this holy meal, we are united with Christ and with one another, forming one body in Him. It is a reminder of our dependence on Christ for our spiritual nourishment, calling us to repent and approach the Lord's Table with reverence and gratitude.

The Sacrament of Holy Baptism: Cleansing and New Life

In Mark 7:1-13, we encounter the Pharisees and scribes criticizing Jesus' disciples for eating with unwashed hands, adhering to human traditions rather than God's commandments. Jesus responds by quoting Isaiah: "This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men" (Mark 7:6-7). He emphasizes the danger of elevating human traditions over God's Word.

In this context, Holy Baptism stands as a divine ordinance instituted by Christ, not a human tradition. It is a sacrament through which God acts to cleanse us from sin and grant us new life. Jesus continues, "You leave the commandment of God and hold to the tradition of men" (Mark 7:8). Baptism is a powerful act of God's grace, washing away our sins and incorporating us into the body of Christ.

Luther's Small Catechism teaches that Baptism "works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare." It is more than a ritual; it is a tangible expression of God's love and mercy, assuring us of His continual presence and faithfulness.

Both the Sacrament of the Altar and Holy Baptism are means by which God engages with us through simple means: bread, wine, and water. They are outward signs of inward grace, visible tokens of God's invisible work in our lives. Through these sacraments, we are drawn closer to Christ, nourished by His grace, and strengthened in our faith. Let us participate in these sacraments with hearts full of gratitude, trusting in God's unwavering love and commitment to us, His people.


