Welcome to Table Talk with Pastor Hanson! Pull up a chair and let's talk about our victory in the Resurrection of Jesus!

The bult of our Epistle readings for this month will follow the Apostle Paul through his exhortations to the churches in Corinth (1 Corinthians 15). What does this have to do with us today?

Resurrection and Victory: A Reflection on 1 Corinthians 15

As we enter the month of February, the world around us is often still caught in the grip of winter, a season that reminds us of dormancy and stillness. Yet, as Christians, we are continually called to remember and live in the hope of resurrection and new life. This hope is beautifully encapsulated in 1 Corinthians 15, a chapter where the Apostle Paul lays out the profound truth of the resurrection and its implications for us as believers, not just on Easter Sunday, but every day of our lives.

The Centrality of the Resurrection

Paul begins this chapter by reminding the Corinthians of the gospel message he preached to them, which they received and on which they have taken their stand. This gospel is centered on the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. "For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures" (1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

The resurrection is not just an addendum to our faith; it is the very cornerstone. Without it, our preaching and faith are in vain. Paul emphasizes that if Christ has not been raised, then our faith is futile, and we are still in our sins (v. 17). The resurrection is the proof of Christ's victory over sin and death, assuring us of our own future resurrection.

Resurrection as Victory over Death

One of the most striking aspects of 1 Corinthians 15 is Paul's depiction of the resurrection as the ultimate victory over death. He declares, "Death has been swallowed up in victory" (v. 54) and boldly asks, "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" (v. 55). This triumphant proclamation reminds us that death, often seen as the final enemy, has been defeated through Christ's resurrection.

For our church today, this message of victory is a source of immense comfort and strength. In a world where death and decay seem to reign, the assurance of resurrection provides hope. It encourages us to face life's challenges with the confidence that nothing, not even death, can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus.

The Transformational Power of the Resurrection

The resurrection also has a profound impact on how we live our lives here and now. Paul urges the Corinthians to let the truth of the resurrection transform their daily lives: "Therefore, my dear

brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain" (v. 58).

This exhortation is just as relevant for us today. As we engage in various ministries, outreach programs, and day-to-day acts of service within our church and community, we do so with the knowledge that our efforts have eternal significance. The resurrection gives our labor purpose and meaning, affirming that what we do for the Lord will have lasting impact beyond this life.

Living as a Resurrection People

Our church, as a body of believers, is called to embody the hope and victory of the resurrection in all aspects of our communal and individual lives. This means being a place where the reality of new life in Christ is evident—in our worship, in our study of God's Word, in our relationships with each other, and in our witness to the world.

1 Corinthians 15 challenges us to not only hold fast to the truth of the resurrection but to let it shape every facet of our existence. As we meditate on this chapter during February, let us be reminded that we are a resurrection people, called to live in the power and victory of the risen Christ.

May we, as a church, continue to stand firm, give ourselves fully to the work of the Lord, and celebrate the hope we have in the resurrection, knowing that in the Lord, our labor is not in vain.

BETHLEHEM LUTHERAN SCHOOL - WISCONSIN PARENTAL CHOICE PROGRAM

Bethlehem Lutheran School will again be participating in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program for the upcoming 2025-2026 school year. The Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP) provides children throughout the state with a full tuition voucher to attend the private or religious school of their choice. You will attend BLS for free if given a voucher.

This program allows families in the Sheboygan area to access the educational program at Bethlehem Lutheran; especially those families who in the past might not have been able to afford to attend.

Bethlehem will be accepting applications for grades 4K-8 for parents who wish to enroll their children at the school through the WPCP. Student applications for the WPCP can be submitted online from February 3- April 17, 2025 at https://sms.dpi.wi.gov/ChoiceParent/.

There is also a link that can be found on our website www.ourbethlehem.com.

The program currently is limited to those families with incomes below 220% of the federal poverty level.



~ A message from Laurie Schultz's classroom ~

Bienvenidos (Welcome) to 2025 from los estudiantes (the students) at Bethlehem Lutheran School. 2025 has already started out with many activities! Whether it be sporting events, a SALSA spelling bee, or preparing for National Lutheran Schools Week, it has been a busy place!

First of all, I wanted to introduce myself since many of you probably don't know much about me and what I do here at Bethlehem. My husband Russ and I moved to the Sheboygan area in 2019 from the Wausau area. I have been teaching for 25 years, with five of those years serving here at Bethlehem. I teach Spanish in grades 4K-8 and Physical Education in 5K-4. I am also the staff coordinator for the forensics program in grades 5-8. I love that I get to teach students every day; it's what I love most!

Just to give you a glimpse into the lives of the students, they are currently learning ball handling skills, hockey, basketball, and badminton in class. It is quite humorous to see the students trying to hit a birdie with their racket. One would think that it would be easy, but it is not. For the past five months a highlight for the students was "Packer Fun Mondays." They knew that if the Packers won, so did they.

Finally, las clases de Español son muy divertidos y prácticas! Yes, Spanish classes are very fun and practical here at Bethlehem! Whether it be learning about colors, animals, family, the community, the body, the alphabet, pronouns, food & drink items, or conjugating verbs, the students are blessed to be learning another language. WHAT IS WORSHIP?

Although much about worship seems similar throughout Christianity, Lutherans have a unique perspective on the question "What is worship?" The Lutheran understanding of worship is expressed in the **Divine Service**.

The Athanasian Creed teaches us that true Christian worship can be recognized in two ways. First, we worship the God who is triune, that is, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The second way we recognize Christian worship is that it is centered on Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God. Our worship is "divine" because it is Christ-centered.

The Lutheran Confessions teach us about the "service" of the Divine Service: "So the worship and divine service of the Gospel is to receive gifts from God" (Apology of the Augsburg Confession, Article V, paragraph 189). In the Divine Service, God, who calls, gathers, and enlightens the whole Christian Church on earth, comes to serve us with His gracious gifts of Word and Sacrament.

People often think that worship is about what we do for or toward God. The reality is quite different. In the Divine Service, God is providing His service for us. In the reading, the preaching, and the proclamation of His Word and in His Sacraments of Holy Baptism and Holy Communion, God comes to us. In worship, God gives His grace and then we respond with thanks and praise.


