Welcome to Table Talk with Pastor Hanson! Pull up a chair and let's talk about the Reformation and the legacy of Christian Education in our congregation!

The Lutheran Reformation and the need for a Director of Christian Education in our Church.

This year, as we approach Reformation Sunday, we are reminded of the pivotal moment in church history when Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg. This act in 1517 sparked the Lutheran Reformation—a movement that reshaped Christianity and laid the foundation for the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS). Luther's commitment to God's Word and the authority of Scripture inspired a return to biblical truth, reforming not just worship practices but also the way Christians are taught and nurtured in the faith. This month, as we celebrate the Reformation, we find ourselves reflecting on how Luther's teachings continue to inform the mission of our church—particularly in the area of Christian education.

One of the core principles of the Reformation was the priesthood of all believers, a concept that highlighted the importance of every Christian being able to engage with God's Word. Luther believed that everyone—children, adults, laypeople, and clergy—should have access to the Scriptures and be educated in their faith. Whether through youth ministries, confirmation classes, adult Bible studies, or outreach efforts, a DCE provides the expertise and passion needed to build a Christ-centered foundation for every stage of life. This ministry goes beyond simply managing programs; it is about fostering discipleship and helping individuals grow as followers of Jesus.

In today's world, Christian education faces challenges Luther could never have imagined. Our children are growing up in a culture that often conflicts with biblical values. Many adults struggle to navigate life's complexities with a firm grounding in their faith. In these times, it is essential that the church offers robust and relevant education to equip believers for everyday life. A DCE is crucial in meeting these needs. By focusing on biblical literacy, faith formation, and life application, a DCE ensures that our congregation is not only learning about the Bible but also living it out in real and meaningful ways.

As Luther taught, education is a lifelong endeavor. We need consistent, faithful teaching to grow as Christians and to face the spiritual and moral challenges of our day. A DCE can provide the leadership to help our congregation not only remain rooted in the Reformation's principles but also to thrive in today's ever-changing world.

The legacy of the Reformation is more than a historical moment—it's a living tradition that calls us to continually renew our commitment to Scripture and to the teaching of the Christian faith. By calling a Director of Christian Education to serve in our congregation, we honor Luther's vision of an educated and engaged church, one where the Word of God is central in the life of every believer.

As we celebrate Reformation Sunday this year, let us reflect on Luther's example and the importance of Christian education in our church. And let us prayerfully consider how a DCE could strengthen our mission to teach, disciple, and nurture the faith of all members of our congregation. Together, we can ensure that Luther's vision of a church grounded in God's Word continues to thrive in our church and in our community for generations to come.

Finishing up a round of golf, Sam complained about being so busy that he cannot golf as much as he wanted to in retirement. "My game is still bad, and I can't play enough to get better. Between doctor appointments, meeting with my financial advisor, attending the two boards I serve on at Church, and all the projects my wife gives me, I just can't play." Frank replied, "I know what you mean. My wife wants us to redo our estate plan, but I keep telling her that I'm too busy already. I think we should just hand it over to the kids and let them worry about it."

This sentiment is far too common, as the task of creating or updating a Christian estate plan seems daunting with the thought of hard work and expense. There is both work and expense involved, but the time invested in your estate is of high value. In the gift plan you create, you are directing the gifts God has given you to steward. He has entrusted them into <u>your care</u>. With that trust comes responsibility to put together a well laid out plan. Your plan will include choosing responsible representatives to ensure accountability, and to make sure the plan God has placed on your heart, is additionally carried out through your legal documents and beneficiary designations.

You do not have to go through this process alone. You have help and resources to help you through this process. You have a friend. In fact, if you start on this project and begin to organize all of your thoughts and wishes, you will find it wasn't really that bad after all. ▼ Director of Christian Education (DCE) ▼

DCEs serve as lifespan ("cradle to grave") Christian educators, who typically serve within congregations and their ministries. Through their leadership and service, they assist and support pastors as they teach the faith to children, youth, and adults.

We have been giving out information on Sunday mornings regarding the possibility of calling a DCE to serve at Bethlehem. It has inspired some questions in terms of what is needed to accomplish this task, or "how do we get this done?"

So....how DO we get this done?

When discussing a position, such as a DCE, there are many layers to bringing in another staff position. We certainly can't discuss all of them in this small space. All of these layers have many moving parts that can cause issues to arrive along the way. However, none of these issues are insurmountable, and all of them require unity of support and dedication from the members of the congregation. After all, the church's workers are here to serve their God by serving you. Let us take a look at just three of these layers, and begin to work through them.

<u>Process</u> - A DCE would be a called position in our church. This means that the Voters' Assembly would need to approve the calling of a DCE. Upon that permission, a call committee would be formed and begin the work of identifying, interviewing, and recommending a person to fill this position. The Voters' Assembly would extend a call to that person, and that person can either accept or decline it. There is also a chance that we could call a new graduate from one of the LCMS colleges.

<u>Cost</u> - Any new staff position in the church or school is going cost \$60,000-\$80,000 once you factor in benefits. We did write some of this money into the budget for this year. As stated in the bulletin insert a couple of weeks ago, the congregation has responded in faithful stewardship. We do have work still to do, and the challenge is still before us. We have to make sure that we can fund this position into the future to complete the work that God has given us to do.

<u>Timeline</u> - This depends upon the congregation and the call process. Once the congregation is willing to take on the financial responsibility of a DCE and gives authority to begin the call process, a conservative estimation would be that the process could take 6-18 months. There are a lot of variables to shorten or lengthen that time frame.


