

Soli Deo Gloria!

I will glory in the Lord; Let the afflicted hear and rejoice.
Psalm 34:2

Rejoice in the Lord always. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Philippians: 4:4-5

Rejoice in the Lord and glory in the Lord! We see this same message throughout the Bible. We as lowly humans acknowledge that God is One to be glorified. To glory in something is to rejoice with pride in whatever that is. In some ways, this could take the form of boasting. We admonish children not to be too boastful about something that they have done. Pride in our accomplishments is good, as long as we remember who truly is worthy of being glorified.

Glory is a word used in the Bible to "describe God's eternal splendor and majesty... God created people in his image to share in his glory, and he endowed them with gifts, enabling them to honor Him with their lives." To glorify the Lord entails much more than words of praise. It includes using those gifts we receive to serve other people and our planet to honor God. Many gifts such as patience, faith, healing, wisdom, and knowledge, among others, are given to us. We can rejoice with our voices as we share the Gospel or sing songs together.

Gentleness is the gift mentioned in our verse from Philippians. The same word is also translated as moderation. Those who use this gift need to do it publicly in a way that "everyone" can see it. Maybe we hold the door for another person even though we are in a hurry. It will be known by everyone that Christians are gentle and caring and not given to excess. As the verse says, it will show that the Lord is near. It is certainly a way to glory in the Lord. In the same way anything we do and accomplish. The same applies to the other gifts we receive – when we use them to glorify God and help others, we also lead them to rejoice in our loving God.

Lord, help us to glorify you in everything we do. With our whole hearts we sing to you, O God, for sending Jesus to show us how to live. We are far from perfect, but if our caring ways can point to your incredible love, then praise you, our Savior. May the joy we feel because of his presence be evident in all we do. Amen.





A MESSAGE FROM THE LCMS FOUNDATION

Life is full of milestone events that impact the gifts we plan from our estates.

In 1971, Herb and Rachel lost their son in the Vietnam War. Though that was 52 years ago, Herb and Rachel still remember the day they received the bad news. Today, their son would have been 71. They wonder why they are still living at 94, when their son's life was so short. They are thankful that in Jesus, both they and their son will live with Jesus in eternity.

A year before their son left for Vietnam, he had married, and his wife was expecting a child when he left. Through the years, Herb and Rachel felt responsible for this child, but now they know that at age 52, their grandson is a successful, happily married man with children of his own. The plans they included in their estate 52 years ago are no longer needed for his survival.

Herb and Rachel feel it is time to rebalance their estate plan, equally dividing the family inheritance between their two surviving children, and this grandson. As they contemplate this, they realize that both of their children, just like their grandson, are quite comfortable financially. But they have been hearing a lot lately at Church that families need scholarship support to send their children to the Lutheran School. There is an endowment fund set up for that purpose. They feel their estate plan should include a gift for this endowment. Yet at their age, the work of figuring this all out on their own seems intimidating. They called their LCMS Foundation Gift Planning Counselor, who led them with some questions, to finally settle on a \$100,000 gift for ministry. They found out they could create this gift simply by changing a beneficiary designation on their IRA which they never touch. They are thankful more children will be taught about Jesus, just like their son was when he was in this school.




