We will be using the text messaging application through Sycamore to notify you of any delays or closures due to inclement weather. If you have not yet signed up, we highly recommend you do.


- Go to "My School" "My Notifications"

- Make sure the "Enable Messaging" box is checked
- Select the correct cell phone number in "SMS" (including area code)
- Select the correct carrier
- Check "School Closing Notifications"
- Click the blue "Update" button in the upper right corner

This system will only be used for the school to send out notifications of urgency. We will not respond to text messages sent to us.
