## **FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR NILES**

### **The Myth of the Silver Bullet**

As the anniversary of my ordination comes and goes each year, I try to take time to evaluate the years and journey of my ministry as a pastor. As I was contemplating this year, I began thinking about the life of the church in general. The internet is full of speculative ideas concerning ministry approaches and successful trends. Blogposts and articles abound promising a “silver bullet” to ministry. There are copious lists of five simple things to do to make the ministry of a church thrive, and yet none of them have the same list of five simple things. As logically inconsistent as these types of articles often are, they are popular for one reason. We buy into their hype. We want to think that we could make the church succeed if we just did the right things. In my contemplation, I kept returning to the same thought:

***While there are many things that we can do that harm the ministry of the church, there is nothing that we can do to make the church succeed.***

With this thought in mind, a natural question comes to mind: ***Then what are we to do?***

*And Jesus said to his disciples, “Truly, I say to you, only with difficulty will a rich person enter the kingdom of heaven. Again I tell you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God.” When the disciples heard this, they were greatly astonished, saying, “Who then can be saved?” But Jesus looked at them and said, “With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible.” ~ Matthew 19:23-26*

In this short passage from Matthew, we see the true “silver bullet” for ministry in the church. **God is the only one who brings success to the ministry and life of the church.** We are called to trust in the work of the Holy Spirit to bring about saving faith in our hearts and the hearts of those who hear the proclamation of the dead and risen Christ. Through Word and Sacrament, the Christ forgives, renews, and regenerates those who are lost in darkness, and makes them lights in the darkness. So with this being said, here is my list of five things to do that will make you successful as the part of the body of Christ.

- 1. Come to worship** - The blessings of Christ received by His people through His Word and Supper are the launch point for the church. They are the means by which we are built up to proclaim the message of salvation and forgiveness to the world.
- 2. Pray for God to give you opportunities for service in His name** - Prayer is the means by which our minds and thoughts are focused outside of ourselves. It is a reminder to consciously be looking for opportunities to give a reason for the hope that we have with gentleness and respect (1 Peter 3:15).
- 3. Trust in God to work through you** - The Holy Spirit had promised to work through our insufficient knowledge and woefully inadequate speech to make the proclamation of Christ powerful to those that hear. He alone can soften hardened hearts through the Gospel message. He promises that the Word of God does not come back void, but always accomplishes its task (Isaiah 55:11).
- 4. Confess your sins and missed opportunities, and believe the forgiveness Christ gives** - We all fall short of the glory of God. However, we have also been forgiven. To repent and trust in God’s promises is the sole duty of the Christian. This is where we receive confidence, power, and strength.
- 5. Repeat** - EVERY WEEK!!!! Repeat these steps with the confidence that in the Lord, your labor is not in vain. But it starts with encountering the blessings of God.

I look forward to seeing you at the altar to begin these steps as we seek to be lights of Christ to the world where God has called us to be. To God be all glory!

### Pray for Jerome

You see, I was walking with my kids the morning after the storm hit and I passed several houses in my neighborhood where entire trees had been ripped from their comfy spot in the ground and gently placed through the roof/front window/garage door of the neighboring house. Absolute carnage in some places. So is this proof that God loves me more than the “Jerome’s” I saw on my walk that morning? Not a chance. However, many people in our world today think this way. They want to point their finger at God (up toward the sky maybe?) and yell at him. “How could you do this to me?” They will shout. (Maybe just in their own head.)

In Romans 8 Paul writes:

*For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else [including storm damage] in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.*

Jerome’s misunderstanding is so far from the reality of the situation. Because the truth of the matter is this: Jesus died on the cross for Jerome’s sins and the sins of the world. God loves Jerome so very much and maybe the branch that landed in the middle of his living room was meant as a sign from Yahweh that reads:

Jerome, repent and believe that Jesus Christ is God and Lord.—Your Heavenly Father

I wish I could make the text in The Visitor blink and flash like neon to show this point.

It is my prayer that Jerome indeed does repent and return to his Lord Jesus. I pray that he would make his way to church over these next weeks and months to seek the blessings of God where they are always found; amongst His people. Additionally it is my prayer that we as the Body of Christ would welcome these people when they enter into our midst. I pray that we would be good stewards of the Gospel mysteries. 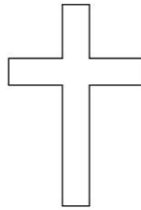

## Giving a cup of cold water

During Jesus' last three years on earth, He spent much time nourishing and teaching His disciples. Only when they were prepared to go out into the world to preach, teach, and heal did He send them. Leaving without provisions, the disciples were totally dependent upon those whom the Lord would send them for their support. The disciples relied upon the power of the Gospel to move the hearts of their listeners who would willingly provide for their needs. They were to travel light and trust in the Lord.

In Matthew 6:40-42 Jesus, referring to His disciples, said, *"He who receives you receives Me, and he who receives Me receives the One who sent Me. Anyone who receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and anyone who receives a righteous man because he is a righteous man will receive a righteous man's reward. And if anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is My disciple, I tell you the truth, he will certainly not lose his reward."*

Jesus told His disciples that whoever gives to you is also giving to Him. Although support today doesn't fund the work of the 12 original disciples, we assist the spreading of the Gospel by supporting today's disciples and missionaries around the world. As we provide for church workers locally and abroad in the name of Jesus, we are serving the Lord Himself.

As we express our Christian faith through our giving and serving, God is pleased. God notices every act of compassion and kindness that we express. In the verse above, He refers to even the simple gesture of giving a cup of cold water to a thirsty person. Through our faith, we are empowered to do acts of service. When we act in response to the Lord and not for recognition, God will bless us. Having already been assured of salvation by God's grace through faith, blessings such as peace, contentment, patience, and hope are added rewards.

Only a small number of people make their living as full-time church workers, but we all are given the privilege and opportunity to be Christ's ambassadors. May God bless us all as we work to further His kingdom.
