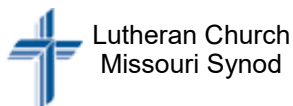

## **FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR NILES**

### **Many But One**

*“I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call— one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift.” (Ephesians 4:1-7)*

One of the beautiful qualities of the church is that it is made up of different people. Each and every one of us is unique. We are unique in appearance, age, skills, abilities, and demographics. Like each part of the body has a distinct function and design, each of the members of the church is a unique asset to the congregation and the church-at-large. Each of us, as we utilize our talents and abilities for the glory of God, make the church and the proclamation of the Gospel stronger.

However, this admirable quality of the church can also lead to its biggest downfall when proper perspective is not maintained. Proper perspective is the substance of Ephesians 4. In the first few verses of chapter 4, Paul gives a strong and compassionate appeal to the Christian church to remember that the uniqueness of individuals does not mean that each individual is an island to himself. He calls Christians back to the fact that their identity is rooted in the same place. While we are different, we are unified through our Lord, through our faith, and through our baptism. We are unified in our hope and in our callings. This perspective reminds us that we are responsible for one another, and we are responsible to one another. Grace was given to each of us in the gifts of Christ for us to use to benefit each other and the world.

Our faith and the church are both corporate in their nature. We are called to be concerned for one another. We are called to be active in the lives of others. We want to know when people are hurt, angry, sad, joyful, happy, and every emotion on the scale. The hand needs the arm. The eye needs the head. Your neighbor needs you. You need your neighbor. You are not alone. It is your baptismal identity to not be alone. So as the church, we need to start acting in a way that reflects the perspective that flows from being part of something bigger than ourselves. We are part of the body of Christ in the world.

We want to know when one of us is in the hospital. We want to know when one of us is struggling. We want to know when something incredible has happened in the life of a member of the body. This raises our eyes off of our own immediate context, and allows us to see the world around us as the mission field. There is one body, one spirit, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one church. You are part of it!

## **From the Desk of Pastor Moon**

### **What is it Really Worth?**

When I was probably 7 years old, I started getting into collecting trading cards. There was an explosion of trading card games right about that time and of course I was just like all my friends. I got sucked into it. Opening packs was a thrill. Trading cards with my friends and classmates on the playground made me feel like I was the General Manager of a professional sports team. "I can trade you my Rookie Ray Allen card for your Brett Favre and Pikachu." So much of these trades and excitement from opening new packs was about perceived value. In other words, how much money is this piece of card stock with a picture printed on it really worth? More importantly how much do my friends and classmates THINK it's worth. If I somehow come into possession of this particular Warrick Dunn card from his days with the Falcons, I know my buddy Jake will give me anything for that.

As I've aged, I see this idea play out in the rest of life too. People make decisions based on what they think something is worth. Not even just monetary. Think of how we use our time. Sometimes we make decisions because something will be time consuming. Think of relationships. I will put forward effort in this relationship because it makes me happy and fulfilled.

Now I want to dwell on this idea in light of a short parable Jesus told.  
Matthew 13:44-46

#### **The Parable of the Hidden Treasure**

"The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and covered up. Then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field.

#### **The Parable of the Pearl of Great Value**

"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls, who, on finding one pearl of great value, went and sold all that he had and bought it.

Ok so it's two parables, but essentially they are the same. Three short verses that really say a lot. Not in terms of words, but in terms of perspective. The character in both of these parables is God. Upon finding his beloved creation he sells everything to have it. That creation is you. You are worth selling everything in order to obtain.

I find this truth to be so baffling. When I was younger, I would dream of finding some rare shiny card that would make all my classmates jealous, but I wouldn't give up everything I owned for it. At a certain point even my little kid brain knew better than to do something so foolish.

That's the beauty of God's love for us in Christ. Jesus was everything to the Father and yet He gave His son to death willingly, and Jesus was just as willing to pay the price and to be that price. On days where you might feel like you are worthless, remember the price that was paid in exchange for you.

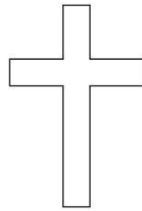
