From the Desk of Pastor Niles

The Day is Now Far Spent

“So they drew near to the village to which they were going. [Jesus] acted as if he were going farther, but they urged him strongly, saying, ‘Stay with us, for it is toward evening and the day is now far spent.’ So he went in to stay with them. When he was at table with them, he took the bread and blessed and broke it and gave it to them. And their eyes were opened, and they recognized him. And he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, “Did not our hearts burn within us while he talked to us on the road, while he opened to us the Scriptures?” (Luke 24:28-35)

Have you ever had one of those days where every ounce of your energy was zapped out of you by the events of that day? Every bit of physical energy gone. Every bit of mental energy gone. Every bit of emotional energy gone. You get home, take your shoes off, go into your bedroom, lay down, and wake up the next morning. In my life, I have only ever had a couple of those days, but they are seared into my memory. As exhausting as any of those days have been in my life, they would not have even compared to just one day of the week that the disciples just had. These followers of Jesus on the road to Emmaus would have had consecutive days of exhausting existence. The man who they had been following, the man in whom they had hoped and trusted, the man who would save them, was dead in an excruciatingly drawn out process. The culmination of their last few years that were supposed to end in triumph were ended in defeat. So when they said “the day is now far spent”, there was so much more wrapped up in that phrase than we could ever know or imagine.

“Stay with us, for it is toward evening and the day is now far spent.” This was how they urged this stranger to accept their hospitality. This stranger was not just someone they did not know, he was actually strange. He was oblivious of the very public events of the last week. He knew the Scriptures with extreme precision and accuracy. He spoke as one who had authority... kind of like... no... that memory was way too painful. It was too soon. They were too exhausted. “Stay with us, for it is toward evening and the day is now far spent.” And stay with them he did.

So they prepared a bite for dinner. The staples of a dinner in that culture. Unleavened bread because it kept longer. Wine because why not? After the previous week, it would be good for their hearts. Then this stranger, in true form, did something strange. He took the bread, blessed it, gave it to them... just like... no that memory was too painful... but as they looked up that memory was right in front of them. The stranger was no longer strange. The stranger was Jesus. But he was dead. But he was in front of them. Maybe the rumors were true. Could he be alive? Obviously he could be, because He was right there. Until he was not. Sooner than they could wrap their minds around everything, Jesus was gone. However, Jesus was not really gone because He was alive. He would always be with them. This was true more than they could have ever known or imagined.

This same Jesus is here for you in the exact same way He was there for the disciples 2000 years ago. He is here for you in the opening of the Scriptures, the breaking of the bread, and at your request after a day, a week, a lifetime far spent. May you always seek Jesus where He always is. And on every far-spent day, may you find rest and comfort in Him.



She passed away on April 19, 2021 at the age of 99.




MEET AMY MULLENS BETHLEHEM'S NEW CHURCH OFFICE MANAGER


