



### FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR NILES

### The Proof that You Need

Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." ~John 20:26-29~

Thomas stood in front of the risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. He was flabbergasted that the other disciples were actually telling the truth. This was no figment of the imagination. This was no ghost or apparition. This was actually THE Jesus. The one that hung on the cross. The one that Thomas saw dead. The one that was laid in the tomb. And now, THAT Jesus was standing in front of him. Jesus was holding out his hands to Thomas beckoning him to come forward and place his fingers in the gaping holes in Jesus' hands. Jesus moved his robe to the side to reveal the hole from the spear. Once again, Jesus beckons Thomas to come and put his hand there. Thomas should not have been surprised at Jesus' actions. This is what Thomas said he needed. "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe."



Can you imagine being Thomas at this point? What do you do? Do you actually go up and put your finger in the holes of his hand? Do you actually put your hand in his side? It would seem kind of silly wouldn't it? I mean what other proof would you need? Jesus is standing right there! John does not tell us what Thomas actually does. John just tells us what Thomas says to Jesus' invitation. "My Lord and my God!" When confronted with the proof, Thomas is left with only one response - to admit that he was faithless. Thomas confesses Jesus in the face of the resurrection. Jesus shows up to make Thomas an example for us. "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." That is us.

However, we have our little bouts with unbelief just as Thomas did. God, why is this happening to me? God, where are you? God, why don't I feel your presence? God, can you really forgive what I have done? Or maybe we get to the point where we do not even ask the question anymore. We just live our life with a God-sized chip on our shoulder in perpetual anger or apathy toward Him, and the blessings He gives. He shows up with His promises attached to the water. He shows up with His body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine. Yet, we prefer to go after the things we see. We try to find comfort in them. We try to define ourselves with them because we can see them. But Jesus shows up again and reminds us, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." He forgives. He shows us Himself. Time and time again.

### FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR MOON

### **Momentary**

Sometimes a good old fashioned "Alleluia!" is just what we need. I can't for the life of me remember an Easter that was more joyous or felt more celebratory than this, the year of our Lord 2022. It might have been personal circumstances within the past year which led to this feeling. It might have been the particularly dreary weather throughout the tail end of Lent. It might have been the extra contemplative and existential nature of conversations with members of our congregation in recent weeks. Or maybe it's something totally unrelated and I will never know for sure! Which is fine, this Easter was incredible, I'm not going to complain.

I guess my point in dwelling on this feeling and the nature of my experience is this: I pray you had a wonderful Easter just like I did. If life has been getting you down, I pray the news of Jesus' resurrection brought a much-needed light to your day and a brilliant smile to your face. If you got bad news from the world, (finances, health crisis, loss of family or friends, etc.) I pray the Spirit was there to remind you of the Truth. Neither life, nor death, angels or demons, nor height nor death or anything else in this world can separate us from the Love of God that is yours in Christ Jesus the Risen Lord. He has made us victors alongside Himself. (Moon translation of Romans 8:36-39)

I was having a conversation with a friend from college about the nature of emotions in this life. "Why can't we always be happy as Christians?" was his question. He already knew the answer, but it was a good primer for our conversation the rest of the afternoon. We came to the conclusion that our sin will always plague us in one way or another. The devil is constantly trying to remove the hope and joy we have in Jesus and His Gospel message.

Then our conversation took an interesting turn. We bemoaned the fact that the moments which bring us joy are always so fleeting. Easter morning goes by like a flash, wouldn't you agree? The joyful songs we sing are only minutes long and in the moment they feel shorter than they truly are. Time flies when you're having fun I suppose. And seriously how is "At the Lamb's High Feast" only 8 verses?

Even simple things that bring joy like a well-timed joke with a friend, a smile shared between family members, the cheers of supporting your kid or nieces/nephews playing sports or musical instruments, the delightful taste of your favorite restaurant food; all these things are momentary. Holding on to these is like trying to squeeze water in your hand: it's eventually going to slip right through your fingers. These things will never last, and that's ok too because they are imperfect.

Our hope is that in the resurrection, these moments will be magnified and extended to eternity. The joy we feel now will pale in comparison to that which will be. Every time you feel these moments slipping through your fingers, where joy is replaced by disappointment, be encouraged by the promise of the resurrection. Jesus is alive. That is a joyful message which will never disappoint and will never end.

Peace of the Risen Lord, Alleluia, Amen

### GOD'S DRAFT CHOICES

Two of the most highly watched sporting events on television are not when teams or athletes are competing against each other; rather they involve the drafting of players for the National Football League (NFL) and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams. For many hours, fans of professional sports will watch intently to see whom their favorite teams will draft.

Most of us won't be drafted by professional football or basketball teams, but, as Christians, we receive a greater calling. We, in essence, are God's draft choices. "You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit" (John 15:16). God has made us a part of His team. We are not chosen by God because we are successful in our careers, great athletes, or wealthy. God chooses ordinary people to do extra-ordinary things. "But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. He chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things—and the things that are not—to mollify the things that are" (1 Corinthians 1:27-28).

Through faith, we understand that we are among the foolish and weak through whom God carries on His life-saving work. "But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us" (2 Corinthians 4:7). God entrusts us—clay jars—with this treasure—the Gospel. Even though we are frail and unworthy of our tasks, God has chosen us to carry His message of love to the world. As humble people of faith, we are empowered by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. He transforms and molds us. "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" (2 Corinthians 5:17). It is God who does the drafting and the changing. Through faith, we will stay on God's team, and we will bear the fruit that He calls us to bear.

The professional athletes who are drafted are expected to perform. They are paid large sums of money to do very athletic things. As God's chosen people, we may not receive large compensation, but our benefits are out of this world! Therefore, we are eager to use our lives and resources in God's service for His glory. Paul wrote, "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10).

What a privilege it is to be part of and serving on God's winning team!
