
The Blessings of Leisure, Rest, and Worship

Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them. And on the seventh day God finished his work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it God rested from all his work that he had done in creation. ~Genesis 2:1-3~





A group of 13 youth and adults recently returned from a mission trip to Nenana, Alaska. It was a week full of blessings as we worked together towards a common mission. I often get asked why Alaska? Hopefully this will help answer some of those questions.

Alaska Mission for Christ is an LCMS organization that places missionaries all over the state of Alaska to share Jesus. Bethlehem began supporting and sending a group on this mission in 2017.

Sending a group 5 times to the same area may seem like it is time to go somewhere else. And while this is certainly a possibility and would provide opportunities to visit new places and help others, here is how we have seen God at work in Nenana.

We have spent time serving in Anchorage and Nenana. This was the 3rd year in Nenana. As we reflected on our first year, we really had to work on building trust and relationships with the people in the community. Nenana is a town of 358 people. They must have been pretty reluctant to have a group of 13 new people stay in their community for 10 days.

We spent time talking to the people. We built trust and an understanding with families. We visited local shops and learned about their history. We listened and built relationships. This is the first step in sharing Jesus.

Fast forward to this past summer, the ground work had been done. When we return to Nenana, it is now visiting friends we have not seen in a year. We are greeted with "Welcome back! We missed you!"

This is how God works. He calls us to be His disciples by sharing His love with those around us. This is done by building trust, by communicating, and serving one another. While it takes time, everything is done in God's perfect timing.

We serve and God does the work, and we certainly have seen Him at work! Our group worked with a large population of Mormons, other denominations, and others who do not have an understanding of God at all. This may seem like an unsurmountable task, but God has given us the words to say to find common ground to have conversations as serve one another. This year we saw a record number of kids attend VBS. We are confident God remains at work!

So, thank you, Bethlehem! Thank you for your support over the years to make this trip happen. It is providing an opportunity for your youth to get out and intentionally share their faith. It provides them with ways to find common ground to share Jesus. And most importantly, it gives them a chance to do the work God has called all of us to do. Keep finding ways to serve in your daily tasks. God is faithful and will provide!


