



Loads of imaginative thinking in reading, writing and creating happen up there.

This year in ELA, we have been focusing on settings and main characters as we read, for our book reports. Together we have traveled to Naomi, Florida with India "Opal" and Winn Dixie in <u>Because of Winn Dixie</u>; to Lister, Florida with Rob Horton and Sistine Bailey in <u>The Tiger Rising</u>; to Copenhagen, Denmark with Annemarie Johansen and Ellen Rosen in <u>Number the Stars</u>; and to Hampton, Virgina with Katherine Johnson and Dorothy Vaughan in <u>Hidden Figures</u>. Our travels are not over, as we will continue on to Camazotz when we read <u>A Wrinkle in Time</u>, and to England and Giant Country in <u>The BFG</u>.

In our art classes, all students have been working together for a collaborative art installation that will be going up after our spring break. We have been exploring

the depths of the ocean and crafting many kinds of oceanic creatures from friendly looking seahorses to attitude filled angler fish. We have been drawing, painting, gluing, and cutting – and best of all with loads of neon and fluorescent paints, colors, and papers. You'll have to check it out when it's displayed. It's sure to get "glowing" reviews.
















Artists at work on their ocean projects.



#### FINANCIAL NOTES - February 2024

#### ENDOWMENT FUND

As of December 31, 2023 the endowment fund has a principal balance of \$892,722.00. Our objective from our <u>Vision 23-25</u> is to have a principal balance of 1 million by December 31, of 2025. Any gifts are appreciated. The interest from one of these funds helps by supporting some of our students with financial aid. A thought. Have you included Bethlehem Evangelical Lutheran Church in your estate planning? If not, please prayerfully consider a gift to Bethlehem. Thank you.

#### **BOARD OF CHURCH PROPERTIES**

We signed a contract for another stained-glass window to be done. The Voters' Assembly approved the project at the November 2023 Voters' meeting. The window will be paid for out of the undispersed fund from the Lutheran Church Extension Fund loan. The next window to be done on our list is the large stained-glass window just east of the Pulpit. The contracted cost is \$17,524.38.

We recently received another donation for the stained-glass window project for approximately \$10,700. We feel confident that we will be able to get another stained-glass window restored this year through donations. So far, we have had 10 windows restored at an approximate cost of \$115,000. The remaining windows total over \$200,000.

If you are interested in donating to the stained-glass window project you can put your over and above regular gift into the offering plate or turn it into the church office. Please designated your gift for the stained-glass window restoration project.

#### **BOARD OF ELDERS**

The Board of Elders put forth a resolution that was approved by the Voters' Assembly to call a Director of Christian Education (DCE). Our pastors put in 60 plus hours a week and are stretched thin. To be able to expand the teaching of God's word and better serve our membership, we need additional help.

Our 2024 adopted budget challenges our congregation to fund the DCE position and several other important items. We need everyone to review their time, talents and treasures and see how else we can help further God's work.
