Are You Committed to Membership for Mission?

"At that time the disciples came to Jesus, saying, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" And calling to him a child, he put him in the midst of them and said, "Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven."

(Ephesians 3:20-21)

In the early 1900's, there was a congregation in rural Missouri who had outgrown their first sanctuary. It came time to look at building a new sanctuary in order to have room for all who wished to attend worship. The congregation was faced with two opportunities for sites on which to build their new sanctuary. A farmer had offered to give them some land outside of town, and another person had offered to give them some land on Main Street in town. So the congregation decided to have a congregational meeting to decide which site they would use. Leading up to the meeting, it was becoming apparent that there was a division in the opinions of the congregation on where their new sanctuary should be built. The farmers wanted the sanctuary outside of town, and the residents of the town wanted it in town. On the night of the meeting, there was a historic snowstorm. Nearly all of the farmers were unable to make it to the meeting because of the weather. However, all of the town-folk were able to attend the meeting. Any guess on where the sanctuary was built? You got it. It was built right on Main Street. This congregation still exists today, and is going strong.

The reason for this account is not to make you think that decisions are only made by those who show up. But it shows that despite the seemingly ill-mannered reason for decisions being made, God still blesses His church. He blessed them with a wise pastor that was able to calm the decisions. He blessed

His people with the grace to understand that their own pride was second to the ongoing mission and ministry of the church. So often we see membership in a congregation like being a member of a country club. If we pay our dues and serve the institution, we get a say and power over what that institution does. Our dues and service give us special benefits. However, this thinking gives us an attitude that is destructive in the church. The primary focus of any congregation is the mission that Christ has given the church - that all would be saved and come to a knowledge of the truth.



So the question should not be "are you a member of a congregation?" The question should be "are you part of the mission of the congregation?" Are you committed to an institution in a certain place or are you engaged and supporting the mission of the congregation? As we move forward as Bethlehem Lutheran Church and School, please remember that our God is bigger than any single decision we make. When we step out in faith in God and the mission that He has give to us (to proclaim His Word for the salvation of all), God can cause good to come of any of it. We put our pride second to His glory and will.

Typically adults cost more than children because in this place, you are allowed to eat as much food as you possibly can. After paying for the meal, you enter into the glutton sanctuary (that's a joke, I love buffets) and are greeted with endless possibilities. Rather than being escorted to a table and having someone else ask what you want to eat and drink, in this place you wander through various serving lines and grab anything and everything that catches your eyes. At a place like Golden Corral, you can mix and match anything. My plate would have a slice of pizza, a small steak, Buffalo wings, etc (sorry if I'm making you hungry). Then it's on to dessert! Pudding with graham crackers and a slice of chocolate silk pie (well shoot now I'm hungry).

The only bad thing about buffets is that the food is not "healthy" and the selection in front of us leads us to make choices we might regret later. But the image of a plate of food overflowing is the type of image we can apply to Psalm 23 when the Psalmist reveals that a table is being prepared for him as his enemies watch and his cup runs over.

Imagine getting to make a plate of all your favorite foods and eat it right in front of those who despise you. That is quite the slap in the face. Where are your manners???

But the food on our plate is not really food at all. The cup that's runs over is not our favorite beverage. God's provisions and grace and mercy overflow even when we walk through the valley of the shadow of death. Not quite what I was expecting when I started talking about a scripture passage often associated with funerals. But that's the type of God we serve. God loves us so much, let us overflow with the same grace and forgiveness.

A surcharge of \$50 per student is added for returning families not completing the required paperwork and making their first tuition payment by August 5.

Tuition pays for only a small part of the student's education at Bethlehem. The cost to educate a child is just under \$9000 per year. The congregation on average helps cover around 75% of the educational costs. Our tuition rates are very low to help families afford a quality Christian education. When you think of the hourly rate, a family pays less than \$3.00 per hour while their child(ren) are in class or about \$20.00 a day for education and care. That is a tremendous bargain! If you need help to cover the cost of tuition please apply for financial assistance. Bethlehem is also a participant in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program. Eligible families can apply online at https://sms.dpi.wi.gov/ChoiceParent/ between February 1st and April 15th. The voucher from this program would cover the entire amount of tuition and registration.

Dear Bethlehem Lutheran Church & School families,

Bethlehem Lutheran School will be again participating in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program for the upcoming 2021-2022 school year. The Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP) provides children throughout the state with a full tuition voucher to attend the private or religious school of their choice. You will attend BLS for free if given a voucher.

This program allows families in the Sheboygan area to access the educational program at Bethlehem Lutheran, especially those families who in the past might not have been able to afford to attend.

Bethlehem will be accepting applications in grades 4K to 8th for parents who wish to enroll their children at the school through the WPCP. Student applications for the WPCP can be submitted online from February 1- April 15, 2021 at http://dpi.wi.gov/sms/choice-programs/student-applications There is also a link that can be found on our website www.ourbethlehem.com.

The program currently is limited to those families with incomes below 220% of the federal poverty level. So what does that number look like? Your adjusted gross income (AGI) would need to be at or below the levels listed below for the size of your family

Here is how the process works:

- The parent or guardian logs into the online parent application.
- Once logged in, the application will take the parent to an instruction page on how to verify the email address.

The parent's instructions read as follows:

You need to verify your email address for the Private School Choice Program Online Application.

- Go to the inbox for your email account for: "email address@email.com"
- Click the "Confirm Email Address" link in the email to confirm your email address.
- Once the parent clicks the "Confirm Email Address" link in the email, the link will take the parent to the email verification confirmation page where it notifies the parent that their email address has been verified.
- 4. On the email verification confirmation page, the parent will be instructed to click on a link to return to the online parent application log-in page where the parent will need to enter his or her email and password to continue the application process.

You will also find a financial aid application for those who may not qualify for the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program. We want to make Christian Education something that you can afford.

Helpful hints:

- Parent does not receive verification email: Please note that it may take 5 minutes to 24 hours for the
 email to arrive. The parent should check his or her spam or junk folders for an email from
 PrivateSchoolChoice@dpi.wi.gov with a subject of "Verify your School Choice Program Email Address".
- Parent must have a valid email: If the parent does not have a valid email, the parent will need to create
 an email using any email provider (such as Gmail, Yahoo, or Outlook.com).
- Parent does not remember the password to their email account: The parent must use the email provider password recovery service or create a new email address to use in the online parent application.
- 4. Email address is incorrect or the parent no longer has access to the email account: The parent must create a new Choice application account using a new email address. The only impact that the parent will have when using a new email address is that the parent will need to reenter data. The system remembers and recognizes continuing students by their first and last names with date of birth.
- Need a new verification email sent: If a parent has not verified his or her email address, the parent may go to the login page for the online parent application and enter their email and password again and a new verification email will be generated.
