This Is The Time For You!

"And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" (Esther 4:14)

The above verse comes from what might be the most peculiar book in all of the Scriptures. Esther is the only book in the entire canon that does not expressly mention God by name. It is simply the account of the life a Jewish woman living in exile in Persia. Her account is quite extraordinary, and one who believes in the existence of the God of the Scriptures can easily see His fingerprints all over the events in the account. Esther goes on to be blessed by God so that her actions could lead to the saving of Jewish lives in the face of extermination. At a moment when she is questioning how in-

volved she should be, her cousin offers the following advice: "Then Mordecai told them to reply to Esther, "Do not think to yourself that in the king's palace you will escape any more than all the other Jews. For if you keep silent at this time, relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another place, but you and your father's house will perish. And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?"

The profundity of this statement is not without application in our own day and time. Each one of us lives each day with the blessings that God gives us. We live in unique situations, unique places, unique families, and unique trials. However, These unique aspects of each of our existences are not random or coincidental. The outcome of our present time is not random or coincidental either. Just as a believer can read the Scriptural accounts of the patriarchs and matriarchs of the faith and see God's care and providence (even when He is not expressly mentioned), a believer can look with hope and certainty at their own lives and see God's care and providence.



This evidence is made abundantly clear when God comes to us with His blessings and love in the Divine Service. His Word is there for your encouragement, and as a faithful proclamation of the lengths through which God would go to have you as His child. The font stands before our eyes as a monument to the ever-present help our God promises to give us in our unique situations. The bread and wine are there as means through which the body broken and the blood shed on Calvary are applied to you. You sit in the midst of the body of Christ to built up and strengthened in your vocations and callings that God has given to you. And who knows whether you have not come to this place for such a time as this? As a matter of fact, you should know for certain that you have come to this place for such a time as this.

From the Desk of Pastor Moon

Routinely in the Word

My morning routine has always been special to me. I am a morning person by nature. I enjoy watching the sun come up. I enjoy the smell of freshly brewed coffee (my mom drank it while I was growing up). I enjoy having peace and quiet for a few moments before the hustle and bustle of the day begins. There was, however, a time in my life when that morning routine was interrupted. Once I got into High School, my dad started taking me to the gym to work out before school. I certainly know it was good for me, but at the time I missed my morning routine tremendously. Years later I became good friends with a man who travelled for work. There were weeks, sometimes even months, where he spent more nights sleeping in a hotel bed instead of at home. One time I asked him how he keeps himself from getting homesick while he's on the road. The answer for him was simple: a morning routine. His morning consisted of waking up early, reading a chapter in Psalms, and listening to a hymn. Once he checked all the boxes he was ready for the day ahead.

It wasn't until this conversation that it dawned on me why I missed my own morning routine so much. I found comfort in something. I had relied on the peace and quiet of the morning to set my mind straight before the day began. This is the type of reliance we should all have on God's Word. It can be in the morning getting us ready for what lies ahead. It can be in the evening helping us unwind from what stands behind.

I have to be honest, doing the daily devotions on Facebook has been one of the high-lights of my ministry so far. At first I was skeptical. 2:30 PM is definitely not primetime for Pastor Moon. But the longer I have been here at Bethlehem, the more I look forward to 2:30 every afternoon for the opportunity to listen to Pastor Niles, or share my own thoughts on a section of scripture.

Deuteronomy 6 has a few things to say about our routine:

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

In other words: it is never a bad time to be in God's Word. The important part is that we are constantly being spiritually fed. If your routine is to read scripture in the morning, Great! If your family shares a devotion around the dinner table, Wonderful! I would encourage you to always find time. Make it part of your routine. The Lord will bless the fruits of your labor.




